Scholarships will be awarded to qualified African American students who are currently enrolled full time at the University of Iowa (UI) and will be enrolled full time at the UI during the next academic year. Scholarships are to be used by students to supplement other financial assistance. All awards will be sent directly to the University of Iowa Office of Student Financial Aid and are restricted to tuition, room and board, fees, textbooks and other directly related educational expenses. Applications must be submitted with the requested materials by Friday, **February 26, 2010**, to be considered.

Eligibility Requirements - To be eligible to apply for the IBAA Scholarship, applicants must meet the following requirements:

- A sophomore, junior, senior or graduate African American student at the University of Iowa.
- Have a minimum 2.5 cumulative grade point average on a 4.0 scale.
- Currently enrolled full time at the UI and will be enrolled full time at the UI during the next academic year.

Application Process and Deadline - Students are required to submit an official application that includes:

- I. A completed application form
- II. An essay (*The essay must be typed, double spaced and included with the application form*).
- III. Two letters of recommendation (*Applicant will distribute the letter of recommendation forms*).
- IV. An official transcript

Completed applications must be postmarked NO LATER than Friday, February 26, 2010. Applications that are received after this date, or applications that are incomplete will be considered ineligible and will be rejected.

Rules and Guidelines

Scholarship Award - The Scholarship award will be paid directly to the University of Iowa. The scholarship award is restricted to costs associated with tuition, room and board, fees, textbooks and other directly related educational expenses that are incurred during the academic year in which the award is granted.

- Award notification will be sent to the University of Iowa.
- The award will be issued in two equal installments over two semesters.

Award Period – The scholarship award must be used by the student/University of Iowa during the academic year (August to August) in which it was awarded. The scholarship award must be used in the year that it was awarded and cannot be carried over to subsequent years. Any remaining funds cannot be carried over to the next academic year or any other academic year following the year of award. All unused funds at the end of the academic year must be returned to the IBAA.

Individuals who choose not to attend the University of Iowa during the academic year in which the award is granted must forfeit their award.

Evaluation Criteria - The applicant will be evaluated for excellence in scholastics, merit, and community service. The following point system will be utilized:

- Scholarship/Overall Academic Achievement (40 Points)
- Community Service/Volunteer Participation (10 Points)
- *Two Letters of Recommendation (20 Points)
- Essay: (30 Points)

**It is strongly recommended that letters come from an academic advisor, professor, instructor, community leader, supervising employer, etc.*

Notification of Scholarship Awards - Applicants selected for a scholarship will be notified of their award via mail or e-mail by **mid-May**. Scholarships will be presented at the Multicultural Awards Reception in May of each year. Recipients will be encouraged to attend this event.

Special Situations - In the event a recipient has to withdraw from the University of Iowa for any reason or if he/she experiences other extenuating circumstances during the duration of the award period, he/she is required to contact the Iowa Black Alumni Association President, Dr. Claranne Perkins, 1810 Vladimir Drive, Bloomington, IL 61704 or phone 309-664-2505 for details.

Status Reports - The Iowa Black Alumni Association is interested in the students' progress during and after the academic year. Recipients are required to submit a status report to the IBAA at the end of each semester. Failure to submit this information may affect future IBAA Scholarship awards.
